AMERICAN INDIAN/ALASKA NATIVE PROGRAMS AND SERVICES

TEMPORARY ASSISTANCE TO NEEDY FAMILIES PROGRAM (TANF)

•CASH ASSISTANCE: Provides cash assistance to low income American Indian/Alaska Native parents and/or relative families caring for a needy child through temporary financial assistance, employment focused services and support services.

Who is eligible for Cash Assistance services?

Participants must be a member of a Federally-Recognized Tribe, listed on the California Indian Judgment Roll or a descendant of either. Participants must reside within the OVCDC service area and meet the program's income and resource limit requirements.

- •PREVENTION SERVICES: Participants are offered educational activities that reinforce healthy relationships, support positive youth development, strengthen Native American culture, and promote self-sufficiency.
- •EMPLOYMENT SERVICES: Provides services to adult and youth job seekers that include job preparedness, job search support and work experience training.
- •FAMILY LITERACY: Provides adult education, parenting education & parent and child interactive activities in a unified program with a focus on self-sufficiency and school-to-work. These family-focused services are intended to improve educational opportunities for adults and children.
- NÜÜMÜ YADOHA LANGUAGE & CULTURE: Supports American Indian language revitalization. Offers a variety of learning opportunities from pre-school to family based settings. Encourages learning through cultural experiences such as basket weaving, beadwork & traditional song and dance.

Who is eligible for Prevention, Employment, Family Literacy and Language & Culture services? Services are provided to American Indian/Alaska Native individuals and families residing within the OVCDC service area who meet program income requirement and/or at-risk indicators. Please contact our offices with questions.

EARLY HEAD START PROGRAM

Provides full-day childcare services, 5 days per week in a center-based program designed to serve low-income families. The program provides comprehensive services with an emphasis on parent involvement.

Who is eligible for Early Head Start services?

The program serves children from birth to three years of age in the communities of Big Pine, Big Sandy and Bishop. **Please contact our offices with questions.**

CAREER ED PROGRAM (CEP)

Funded by a grant through the Native American Career and Technical Education Program (NACTEP), the CEP supports American Indians pursuing vocational and technical careers and certificate programs in collaboration with Cerro Coso Community College-Eastern Sierra College Center.

Who is eliqible for Career Education services?

American Indians residing in Inyo and Mono Counties. Please contact our offices with questions.


KERN INDIAN EDUCATION CENTER (KIEC)
