

All required documents for Cash Aid participants are mailed as a courtesy. It is always the participant's responsibility to make sure they submit their Monthly Eligibility Report (MER) and all other documents on time.

*Please note— Due to COVID-19, documents CAN be emailed to the case counselor or site manager. You can also take photos of your receipts. Don't forget we have a mail slot on site for you to drop off your documents as well.

Due Dates

- All MERs are due on the <u>1st of the month</u> and <u>no</u> later than the 10th.
- MER's <u>received after the 10th</u> are considered late and <u>will result in a late payment</u>. "Lost in the mail" or "late due to mail" will not be an acceptable excuse.
- If your MER is turned in after the 10th, please remember to complete a 10-day waiver form.
- MER'S WILL NOT BE ACCEPTED BEFORE THE 1ST DAY OF THE MONTH. NO EXCEPTIONS.

Reminders

- If you would like to have Direct Deposit, ask your Case Counselor or Program Assistant for a form to take to your bank. This will help you receive your TANF payments in a more timely manner.
- ALL CHECKS WILL BE MAILED
- Any and all events you see in this newsletter, that are facilitated by OVCDC (TANF/Family Lit./KIEC), are countable participation hours <u>if</u> approved to be on your FSSP. If you're not sure you've been approved or would like to be approved, please make an appointment with your Case Counselor before participating.
- Please provide at least a <u>24 hour notice</u> when requesting a Benefit Summary or any other documents from your file.



- Please remember to fill your MER out completely and sign/date
- Remember to submit proof of income (if applicable)
- Contact your Case Counselor (Magdalena Rodriguez) at 805.676.0750

When Submitting Supportive Service Requests (SSRs):

- Please fill out form completely, including amount and provide a description.
- Remember you must submit receipts
- PLEASE be sure to PRINT your <u>FIRST and</u> <u>LAST NAME on EACH RECEIPT</u> you are submitting

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Have you recently experienced an emergency crisis or natural disaster situation? If so, OVCDC, may be able to assist in the short term.

In order to be eligible, families must meet the following criteria:

- Be an American Indian/Alaska Native family residing in Fresno, Inyo, Kern, Kings, Mono, Tulare or Ventura counties.
- Have monthly income at or below 300% of the Federal Poverty Guidelines:

- Provide verification of the need being requested.
 Examples include:
 - Short term mortgage or rental assistance
 - Short term utility or energy assistance

AFFORDABLE CONNECTIVITY PROGRAM

WHAT IS IT?

The Affordable Connectivity Program is an FCC program that helps connect families and households struggling to afford internet service.

The benefit provides:

- Up to \$30/month discount for internet service;
- Up to \$75/month discount for households on qualifying Tribal lands; and
- A one-time discount of up to \$100 for a laptop, desktop computer, or tablet purchased through a participating provider.

WHO IS ELIGIBLE?

A household is eligible for the Affordable Connectivity
Program if the household income is at or below 200% of the
Federal Poverty Guidelines, or if a member of the household
meets at least one of the criteria below:

- Participates in any of the following assistance programs: SNAP, Medicaid, Federal Public Housing Assistance, Veterans Pension or Survivor Benefits, SSI, WIC, or Lifeline;
- Participates in any of the following Tribal specific programs: Bureau of Indian Affairs General Assistance, Tribal TANF, Food Distribution Program on Indian Reservations, or Tribal Head Start (income based);
- Participates in the Free and Reduced-Price School Lunch Program or the School Breakfast Program, including through the USDA Community Eligibility Provision;
- · Received a Federal Pell Grant during the current award year; or
- Meets the eligibility criteria for a participating broadband provider's existing low-income internet program.

TWO STEPS TO ENROLL

1

Go to AffordableConnectivity.gov to submit an application or print a mail-in application

2

Contact your preferred participating provider to select an eligible plan and have the discount applied to your bill.

Some providers may have an alternative application that they will ask you to complete.

Eligible households must <u>both</u> apply for the program <u>and</u> contact a participating provider to select a service plan.




