

## HALLOWEEN SAFETY TIPS

#### PRACTICE STREET SAFETY

- Remind children to look both ways before crossing the street, use crosswalks, and stay on sidewalks whenever possible.
- Drive slowly with your lights on. Be an the lookout for children crossing the street quickly in undesignated crossing areas.

#### BE VISIBLE

- Only approach well-lit homes with a porch light on. Never enter a stranger's home or a vehicle.
- Carry a flashlight or add reflective tope to costumes and treat buckets.

#### TRICK OR TREAT IN A GROUP

- Use the buddy system and be sure children stay with a responsible adult.
- · Designate a meetup spot or plan in case you get separated.

#### TREATS

- · Wait to eat any treats at home so you can closely examine for spoiled or unwrapped items
- Avoid eating homemade treats. Only eat packaged and sealed treats.

#### COSTUME SAFETY

- Try on costumes early. Be sure costumes and shoes fit properly to avoid tripping.
- Apply makeup in a small area ahead of time, to be sure no reaction occurs.
