

- **From The Family Advocates**
- ♦ All required documents to cash aid clients are mailed as a courtesy and a self addressed stamped envelope is provided to each client that has requested it.
- ♦ However, it is always the client's responsibility to make sure that their Monthly Eligibility Report (MER) and any other documentation is received in the office.

Due Dates

- ◆ All MERs and **Supportive Service Requests** are due on the 1st of the month and no later than the 10th.
- ◆MER's received after the 10th are considered late and will result in a late payment. "Lost in the mail" or "late due to mail" will not be an acceptable excuse.
- ♦ If your MER is turned in after the 10th, please remember to complete a 10-day waiver form.
- **♦ MER's WILL NOT BE ACCEPTED BEFORE THE 1ST** DAY OF THE MONTH, NO EXCEPTIONS.

Reminder

◆ If you would like to have Direct Deposit, ask your Family Advocate or Program Assistant for a form to take to your bank. This will help you receive your TANF payments in a more timely manner.

+ ALL CHECKS ARE TO BE MAILED

♦ Any and all events you see in this newsletter, that are facilitated by OVCDC (TANF/Family Lit./KIEC), are countable participation hours if approved to be on your FSSP. If you're not sure you've been approved or would like to be approved, please make an appointment with your Family Advocate before participating.

- Benefit Summary or any other documents from your file.
- When turning in Support Service Request, please read Disclaimer and remember to complete the budget on the back of the Support Service Request form.

When Submitting

- ◆ PLEASE be sure to write your **first and last name on** each receipt you are turning in.
- ◆ Stamped envelopes are available to those who would prefer to mail in their monthly paperwork. Let Trina or your Family Advocate know if you'd like one mailed to you at the end of each month.
- ◆ PLEASE FILL OUT and Sign the MER Submission and Check List at the front counter. This form needs to be completed every time you DROP OFF your MER, SSR's and/or any other documents, this will help avoid miscommunication and be used as backup, should your paperwork be misplaced.
- ◆ If you need to make an appointment with your Family Advocate, you may speak to Trina and she will be happy to assist you with making that appointment.





Lower income, government program participants
(SSI, Medicaid, WIC, SNAP, FPHA, Lifeline, etc.) K-12
students attending schools that are CEP recipients or
on Free or Reduced lunch programs, and College
students with a Pell Grant. There are many other
ways to qualify.

AFFORDABLE CONNECTIVITY PROGRAM

WHAT IS IT?

The Affordable Connectivity Program is an FCC program that helps connect families and households struggling to afford internet service.

The benefit provides:

- Up to \$30/month discount for internet service;
- Up to \$75/month discount for households on qualifying Tribal lands; and
- A one-time discount of up to \$100 for a laptop, desktop computer, or tablet purchased through a participating provider.

WHO IS ELIGIBLE?

A household is eligible for the Affordable Connectivity Program if the household income is at or below 200% of the Federal Poverty Guidelines, or if a member of the household meets at least one of the criteria below:

- Participates in any of the following assistance programs: SNAP, Medicaid, Federal Public Housing Assistance, Veterans Pension or Survivor Benefits, SSI, WIC, or Lifeline;
- Participates in any of the following Tribal specific programs: Bureau of Indian Affairs General Assistance, Tribal TANF, Food Distribution Program on Indian Reservations, or Tribal Head Start (income based);
- Participates in the Free and Reduced-Price School Lunch Program or the School Breakfast Program, including through the USDA Community Eligibility Provision;
- Received a Federal Pell Grant during the current award year; or
- Meets the eligibility criteria for a participating broadband provider's existing low-income internet program.

TWO STEPS TO ENROLL

1

Go to AffordableConnectivity.gov to submit an application or print a mail-in application

2

Contact your preferred participating provider to select an eligible plan and have the discount applied to your bill.

Some providers may have an alternative application that they will ask you to complete.

Eligible households must <u>both</u> apply for the program <u>and</u> contact a participating provider to select a service plan.

Have you recently experienced an emergency crisis or natural disaster situation? If so, OVCDC, may be able to assist in the short term.

In order to be eligible, families must meet the following criteria:

- Be an American Indian/Alaska Native family residing in Fresno, Inyo, Kern, Kings, Mono, Tulare or Ventura counties.
- Have monthly income at or below 300% of the Federal Poverty Guidelines:

- Provide verification of the need being requested.
 Examples include:
 - Short term mortgage or rental assistance
 - Short term utility or energy assistance
 - Clothing allowance
 - Other assistance that may be necessary due to your crisis situation
